EPHRAIM ASCULAI WORKED AT THE ISRAEL ATOMIC ENERGY Commission (IAEC) for over 40 years. In 1986, after having served as the head of the IAEC's Environmental Research Department, he went to work at the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) in Vienna where he concentrated on issues of radiation protection. While at the IAEA, he became the first Coordinator of the Emergency Assistance Services, and during 1990–1991, he was the Scientific Secretary of the International Chernobyl Project. In 1992, he returned to Israel and was involved in the deliberations leading to the conclusion of the Comprehensive Test-Ban Treaty (CTBT). Later, he served as an expert in a working group of the CTBT Preparatory Commission, concentrating on the topics of radionuclide measurements and on-site inspections. During his final period at the IAEC, he served as the Director of External Relations. He also served in several national fora, most notably as the Chairman of the Interministerial Steering Committee on Hazardous Materials and Natural Disasters. During his sabbatical at ISIS in 2000–2001, he worked as a senior research fellow.

Ephraim Asculai received his Ph.D. in Atmospheric Sciences from the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. Dr. Asculai retired from the civil service in 2001, and is currently a private consultant.
